Regents Update Articulation Agreement with Southeast Tech

VERMILLION - During its regular meeting on June 25, the Board of Regents approved updates to an articulation agreement for two programs between South Dakota State University and Southeast Technical Institute.

STI students who graduate with an associate of Applied Science degree in Cardiovascular Medicine or Nuclear Medicine can apply their credits directly toward an SDSU Bachelor of Science degree in Health Promotion – Allied Health Specialization.

This agreement is intended to provide an efficient way for AAS prepared students to matriculate to an accredited Bachelor of Science degree program to support professional mobility or access to graduate study.

In addition, SDSU and Black Hills State articulate many AAS programs from STI and other technical institutes to the Bachelor of Applied Technical Science programs approved at these two institutions. The BATS degree is also available to students who choose to attend USDSU Sioux Falls.
