Dakota State Offers 12-Hour Certificate in Research Computing

SPEARFISH, S.D. – Dakota State University is broadening its outreach in high-tech computing with a new certificate program. University officials said the 12 credit-hour program is intended for individuals not currently enrolled in college who want to expand their computer science skills into high-performance computing.

The new certificate program, available this fall, prepares individuals to work in high-performance computing environments and to deal with the demands of scientific and research computing. In June, the Board of Regents authorized a new minor in this same field for Dakota State University.

The certificate will be especially attractive to people who already have a background in computer science, computer information systems, and computer and network security, and wish to expand their knowledge base and employment opportunities in high-tech computing, high-speed networking, and research.
